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
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Dear IPS Community,

Thank you to those parents who attended last weekend's working bee led by Mr McKay. Your efforts will ensure the school is in great shape for the Twilight Fair.

Classes for 2018

In developing the classes for a new school year staff work together to form, well balanced classes of students that take into account the social, emotional, academic and physical characteristics of each child.

In consultation with staff, after considering student numbers there will be 28 classes in 2018. No composite classes will be offered.

The process of forming classes has commenced.

Teachers will give students the opportunity to select 5 peers with whom they feel they could work well with. Teachers will then endeavour to accommodate these selections endeavouring to ensure that at least one or more (where possible) students is placed in the same class.

All staff members with knowledge of students will be required to work collaboratively to create draft classes of students for the following year. When forming classes consideration will be given to balancing Year levels according to this order:

1. teacher judgement: academic ability/needs, behaviour
2. gender
3. previous class placements
4. student preference list

This is a clearly defined, collaborative process for the placement of students into classes to ensure the best possible outcome for all students in the following year. Once draft classes are completed, the principal may make alterations where appropriate before final lists are published. Staff members will not disclose the composition of proposed classes prior to any formal announcements as the enrolment profile, although unlikely, may change in the latter stages of Term Four. Details relating to classes will be released to parents during the final week of Term Four.

Here's another recipe to bake for the Fair Cake Stall

Melting Moments

INGREDIENTS

- 125g butter, softened
- ¾ cup (115g) plain flour
- ¼ cup (45g) icing sugar mixture
- ⅓ cup (50g) custard powder
- 60g butter, softened, extra
- ⅔ cup (110g) icing sugar mixture, extra
- 2 teaspoons finely grated lemon rind
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice

METHOD

Step 1 Preheat oven to 160°C. Line 2 oven trays with baking paper. Use an electric mixer to beat butter until pale and creamy. Add the flour, icing sugar and custard powder and use a wooden spoon to stir to combine.

Step 2 Use your hands to roll teaspoonsful of the dough mixture into balls. Place the balls 3cm apart on the lined trays. Use a fork dusted in icing sugar to gently flatten. Bake in preheated oven, swapping trays halfway through cooking, for 15 minutes or until just cooked through. Remove from oven and set aside for 30 minutes to cool.

Step 3 Use an electric mixer to beat the extra butter and icing sugar in a bowl until light and fluffy. Add the lemon rind and juice and beat until combined. Spread the butter mixture over the flat side of half the biscuits and sandwich together with remaining biscuits.

Variation: Try passionfruit melting moments for a delicious change. Simply add the strained pulp of one passionfruit to step 1 and replace lemon rind and juice with 1 tbs of passionfruit juice to make the butter cream.
