
A new face in the office.

As I reflect on student achievement, I am heartened that in an increasingly complicated world IPS School Values of Respect, Independence, Confidence, Resilience and Persistence are being applied and developed across many areas of our school. Developing these values in primary school will hold firm in secondary school and on to what every pathway these students may walk as an adult. It is incumbent on ALL of us to help our students, your child(ren) make good choices and seek out those opportunities to grow and learn in order to become the very best they can be.

How? – Perhaps with a conversation.

As we saw on the world stage of cricket, sometimes the people we expect to set the example fail us and although we understand that it is okay to make mistakes, deception for personal gain is not okay. Examples like this need to be contextualised and discussed so that children draw their own conclusion that this sort of behaviour is inappropriate from anyone regardless of their status.

You never know when an opportunity might arise for a conversation with young people about respect. This could be a proactive, preventative conversation or it could be that you've seen an incident that needs addressing. Every time we speak out against disrespectful behaviours, we are one-step closer to changing the world for the better. Whether the behaviour is violence, psychological abuse, bullying, teasing, making someone feel sad or standing by and doing nothing. It is not okay!

It is not always going to be easy, but it is a conversation worth having. Children / students need to be helped to understand and trust that the teacher, the parent, parent helper, admin person, principal class will listen objectively and provide support where necessary.

Things to highlight in conversations:

- The importance of respect between people, no matter what their age, gender or background.
- Having the confidence to speak out against disrespectful attitudes and behaviours.
