SCHOOL'S GREEN ASPIRATIONS

AN INCOMPLETE gardening project in need of some green at Ivanhoe Primary School could soon be revitalised through a Leader Local Grant.

An inclusive sensory garden was designed by the school two years ago, but its construction fell through because there was not enough funding. Principal Mark Kent said he

Principal Mark Kent said he hoped to add trees, flowering plants and garden beds to the area, which currently has a concrete path and an empty cubby house.

"This quiet space will encourage diverse types of play and build friendships," he said. "It can also be used for innovative classes and allows quieter kids to get away from the hustle and bustle of the playground."

Ivanhoe Primary's enrolment numbers have increased rapidly in the past few years, with 620 students now at the school. A number of other schools in Banyule have applied for the grant: Rosanna Golf Links Primary hopes to build a sandpit and Mary Immaculate Primary School wants help with its outdoor space.
