School Community is a legislative and regulatory requirement for all Government schools under the Education and Training Reform Act 2006 and the National Education Agreement 2008.

Leadership and creating curious learners.

On Tuesday 29th May the IPS School Improvement Team (SIT) spent the day working with our Community of Practice (CoP) partners, Heidelberg PS, Rosanna PS, Viewbank PS, Fairfield PS, Thornbury PS and a number of secondary schools working on our shared focus of Engagement and Curiosity. The morning was spent on Engagement of learners and igniting curiosity followed by Inquiry based learning and how these elements best underpin teaching and learning. We are following up with staff discussions on putting theory into practice.

Our aim is to make best practice common practice across the school.

Want to help your child at home?

Research shows that families are the most significant influence on their children's learning, development, health, safety and wellbeing. Through everyday activities at home you can also help them develop their numeracy skills, such as calculating and using numbers, recognising patterns, and using language to develop mathematical understanding.

These literacy and numeracy activities are excellent opportunities for you to model key learning values such as enthusiasm, persistence and curiosity.

Helping your child to speak and listen – Discussing news and current events.

As your child gets older, they become more aware of news and current events. Discussing news and current events can enrich your child's understanding of the world. Questions are an effective way to encourage your child to think critically about an event and can help foster empathy. Questions also help your child to develop oral fluency when discussing social issues.

Questions you might ask when discussing a news story or current event include:

- » What do you think caused the event? » How do you think people will be affected? » Is it fair?
- » Why do you think people think that/do that? » What do you think will happen next?
- » How could the problem be fixed?

Some other activities to develop your discussion:

- » Read several articles together on the same issue to get different opinions. Then discuss the different opinions.
- » Have a debate on a topic, with you and your child taking different sides of the issue.
- » Download and listen to podcasts on an issue and discuss it.
- » Discuss different "What if?" scenarios.

These will help develop your child's problem solving, imagination and a healthy curiosity.

OSHC – The new Child Care Subsidy will affect you from 2nd July. Take action.

From 2 July 2018, there will be a new Child Care Subsidy that will replace the current Child Care Benefit and Child Care Rebate. If you have not already done so it is essential that you complete an online assessment to receive the new payment. TerraCycle challenge.

The organisation, TerraCycle, is currently collaborating with Colgate and Chemist Warehouse to collect and recycle oral care waste and they are encouraging school communities to gather oral care waste. As a result schools also have a chance to win community garden equipment. Regardless, what a great way to contribute to the longevity of planet earth. Percy (Environmental Leader 1D) and his mum – Rachelle will be coordinating the project.

Accepted oral care waste includes: any brand of used toothpaste tubes, toothbrushes, plastic toothbrush packaging, interdental brushes, wisps, pumps, stand up toothpaste bottles and any kind of non-electric toothbrush or toothpaste tube and all affiliated non-recyclable packaging. The majority of these items cannot be placed in the curbside recycling bins so we really need a large community of people, such as IPS, to redirect these items from landfill.

An appropriate receptacle for these items will be situated across from the school office from next Monday. - Capital Works update fortnightly site meetings and works are running to time.
- No further update to future \$4.5 million Masterplan.
- Refurbishment of Main Waterdale Rd building update new nonslip mats purchased and bull nosing to staircases to be replaced during the school holiday period.
- Collaborative furniture is being investigated.
- Quotes for heating/air-conditioning changes sort.
- Some of the new bicycle racks purchased by the Banyule City Council Grant have been installed.
- The school was unsuccessful in obtaining the Local Leader Schools Grant to improve our inclusive school playground.
- Annual Report Implementation presented 2018 Regional Leadership Conference attended by staff,
 Inspiring Teaching and Learning Creating the Education State.
- Staff engaging in Curiosity and Powerful Learning Forum.
- CASEA program screening for year 1 to year 3 students has been completed and the CASEA team is working
 with families.
- DE&T contracted ISS Facility Services reviewed the school cleaning and will take over the cleaning contract on July 2nd2018.
- Approved the hosting of a cultural exchange group of students from China and that all funds received are used to resource our current EAL program.
- Approved the attendance of 6 parents for the Coonawarra Camp.
- Approved the application for a TerraCycle Grant involves the recycling of oral care waste.

Imagine, Design, Innovate Together


