Want to help your child? Coding and Problem Solving.

Computer programming (coding) is basically just giving a set of instructions to tell a computer, machine, robot or drone how do to something. There really isn't anything mystical or extremely difficult about it. It can be similar to learning a new language and figuring out where the pieces go together. It can be very similar to following a recipe or an IKEA leaflet to build that bookcase!

For your children to live and work in the future, coding will be a skill they can't do without. Learning a little bit about coding for yourself will help you to help your children. It doesn't have to be boring and you don't have to print "Hello World" on a computer screen either. You can use apps and websites that make it fun. Games are fabulous way to work with your child to build coding and problem solving skills.
