JSC Free Dress Day considered by School Council

The Free Dress Day proposition from the Junior School Council was considered and discussed by School Council at the October meeting. It was agreed that there would be one Friday each month that students can elect to wear sensible casual clothes. It is not compulsory and casual wear must be sensible. For example, sun smart, closed toe shoes and the school hat MUST be worn outside. Clothing must not be restrictive as sport and physical education lessons often occur on a Friday. If Free Dress Day clashes with a school excursion, sporting event or other activity where the school uniform is more appropriate then the school uniform MUST be worn.

The Free Dress Days for November and December will be published shortly after consultation with staff. This trial is for the remainder of 2018 only.

Remembrance Day – Sunday 11th November




Sunday, 11th November 2018 marks the 100th anniversary of the Armistice which ended the First World War (1914–18). One hundred years ago, on 11th November 1918, the guns of the Western Front fell silent after four years of continuous warfare. In the four years of the war more than 330,000 Australians had served overseas, and more than 60,000 of them had died. Each year on this day Australians observe one minutes silence at 11am, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts. The social effects of these losses cast a long shadow over the post-war decades. Some Year 6 students (and teachers) were able to locate the names of family members killed in conflicts.
