The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level it is only one of a number of tools used by teachers to measure student progress. Please share the NAPLAN Student Message with your child.

Want to help your child at home?

At Ivanhoe Primary School, all students participate in and enjoy one Italian session each week. Students learn about Italy's culture and its historical beauty, sometimes visiting well known icons via Google Earth.

School Council

President's Report from 01/05/2019

Following an approach from Vacation Care providers about running school holiday programs at IPS, School Council has been considering whether or not to include such a service at our school. During last night's School Council meeting, we received presentations from two different providers, who gave an overview of their service, how it runs and what a potential partnership with IPS might look like.

Given that many of our students already access this type of care during holiday periods, it was felt that the addition of such a service could be a positive step for the school community. School Council will seek to undertake some further comparative analysis of what each service can provide, which will also consider how these services address the needs of our students and school community. In the next few weeks, we will also be developing a survey for families to gauge whether or not this is a service you would access, and to seek your input on what that service would need to include for it to be a viable option for your children to attend.

In receiving all the sub-committee reports, it was decided to dissolve the Digital Learning & Technology (DLT) committee. After reviewing its Terms of Reference, it was agreed that the DLT committee had achieved its vision and that the outcomes of the work this group had undertaken were now imbedded into our practices.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank the staff and parents who have served on the DLT committee to date and to acknowledge the achievements they have made. In particular, I'd like to recognise the leadership of Steven O'Callahan and Hannah Crowley for their fantastic efforts in championing how we explore the use of digital technologies to enhance learning experiences, and in helping our school to emerge as leaders in digital learning practice.

Council also considered a Business Plan for the 2019 Fair, which contextualised how the event will be run from an operational and financial standpoint. The Plan articulated the leadership team and their roles on the event, initial plans for programming, branding and communications, financial management (including the procurement and management of Fair Supporters) and a detailed timeline of key milestones to be met between March and the event delivery in November. We also motioned to endorse William Huxley as the Fair's Platinum Supporter for 2019. This is the highest tier of support offered for the Fair, which will include a \$5,000 cash contribution as well as the supply and installation of all of our board signage to promote the Fair, which is a substantial in-kind contribution.

For those interested in learning more about the plans for the 2019 Fair and how you can get involved, the Fair Committee are hosting an Information Evening tonight (Thurs 2 May) from 7pm in the Multipurpose Room. If you have ideas you would like considered or included, if you want to contribute to the programming in some way, or if you're looking to be more heavily involved in the Fair, then I strongly encourage you to come along this evening to hear more about the ways you can participate.

NAPLAN student message

A message to our students

To our valued students in Year 3 and Year 5,

In two weeks you will sit your NAPLAN tests.

Before you take these tests there is something very important for you to know. This test does not assess all of what makes each of you exceptional and unique. The mark you get from these tests will tell you how you did on that day, but they won't tell you everything.

NAPLAN can't tell you that you have persisted and improved on something you used to find difficult.

NAPLAN can't tell you that you brighten up your teacher's day but we know you do.

NAPLAN can't tell you how amazingly special you are but we know you are.

The people who mark these tests don't know that you may love to sing, that you may love to draw, that you help your friends when they need you. They don't know that some of you can dance, speak another language, play music, are good at chess or can speak confidently in front of your class or at assembly.

They do not know that you participate in sports or that you help your mum or dad or that you play with your little brother, sister or cousins.

They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that every day you come to school to do your best, because these attributes cannot be tested.

So when you come to school ready to do your best at NAPLAN remember, "There is no one way to test all of the wonderful things that make you, YOU!"

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate in the annual NAPLAN assessment. Some students may qualify for adjustments that reflect the support normally provided for classroom assessments. You should first discuss the use of any adjustments for your child with your child's teacher. A formal exemption may be granted for a student with disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or for a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background.

Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

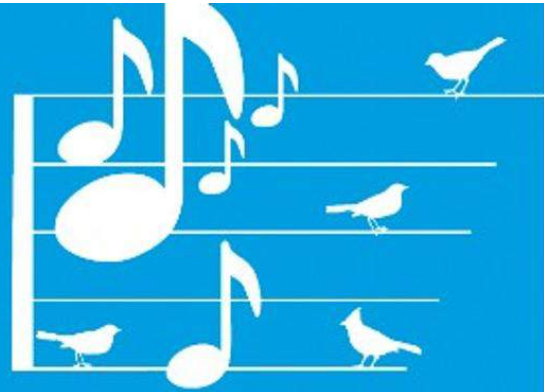
NAPLAN is about assessing learning progress in literacy and numeracy.

ANZAC DAY CELEBRATIONS IN 1K

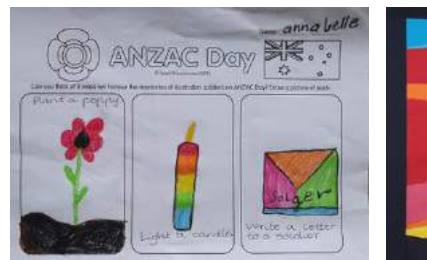

Digital Learning Technologies The co-contribution



Digital disruption is now common-place and the potential of technology in the future world that our students will shape, is something that many of us can't even imagine.

Already, what was science-fiction yesterday – is science-fact today: Our pets are micro-chipped; cars are driver-less; and robots can vacuum houses!

The Digital Learning Technology (DLT) program at Ivanhoe Primary School has been an exciting initiative across both the teaching and student populations.

Our DLT Vision:

Digital Learning at IPS will be irresistibly engaging for students and teachers across all learning areas and domains. Our students will become innovative and confident users of digital technologies, using technology to communicate, collaborate, curate and create, while fostering higher order thinking skills and real life problem solving.

Three years ago we introduced the Digital Learning Technology Co-contribution so that we could build some strong foundations for the achievement of enhanced learning outcomes in this important area.

In 2019 we will be continuing to invest in the tools and knowledge required for teachers and students across all year levels. Our primary focus for this year is:

1. Further increasing student access to technology tools and resources; such as 3D Printers, web conferencing devices, coding and robotics.
2. Increase student access to Innovative furniture for collaboration.
3. Develop and resource a STEM program.
4. Subsidise science and technology related incursions.
5. Increase access to regular technical support.
6. Support and teach staff to increase their confidence and capacity to use technology in the classroom with your children.



Since we began the DLT initiative, feedback from parents of students entering Year 7 is that IPS students are now starting secondary school with the right technological skills, aptitude and attitude to learn. Four years ago technologically speaking IPS was in the lowest quartile compared to the other government schools and now we are somewhere near the top. Thanks to the dedication of our staff, the enthusiasm of our students and your support.

As many will relate to – it is one thing to master new technology yourself, it's another thing all together to teach it to someone else! We are absolutely committed to providing the tools and building the capacity of our teachers so they can make our DLT vision a reality.



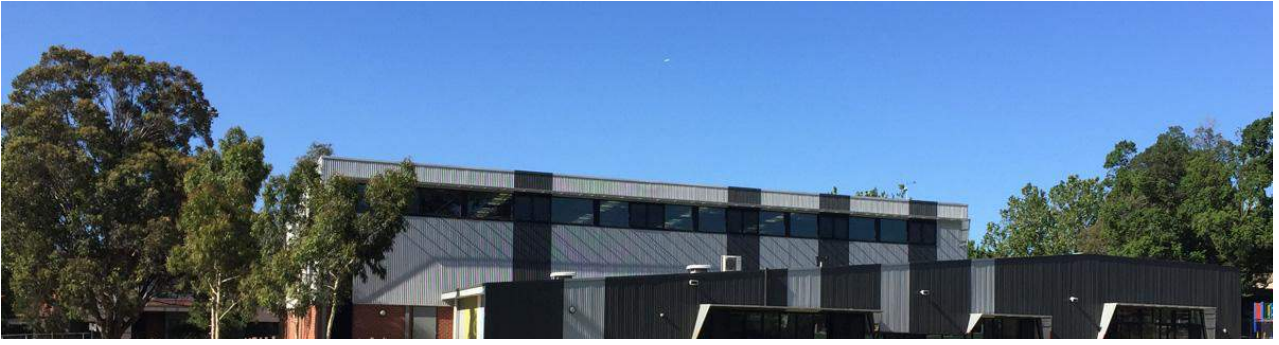
