NAPLAN 14th - 16th May

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level it is only one of a number of tools used by teachers to measure student progress.

Please share the NAPLAN Student Message with your child.

Want to help your child with reading?

The following questions require your child to get clues from the text to answer:

How do you think the character was feeling?

How would you change the ending?

How would you describe the changes in the character/setting?

These questions require your child to refer back to the text:

What were the characters' names?

What was the setting?

What did each character do?

What happened at the beginning, middle and end of the text?

The following questions require your child to think about the main messages:

What do you think is the main message in the story or text?

Can you relate it to another event or issue?

Do you agree with the views of the author?

What is your opinion about the message in the story?

How could other people see it differently?

Curriculum Day Report

The agenda

Our agenda for in the morning looked at Cultural Understanding and Safety Training as it relates to the aboriginal people of Australia. The training is a key commitment in the Marrung: Aboriginal Education Plan, Victoria's ten-year plan to support improved outcomes for Koorie learners across early childhood, schools, skills and training, and higher education.

The session was lead by five Koorie Engagement Support Officers. The purpose of which was to increase our understanding of Koorie culture, history and experience to ensure a strong foundation for culturally inclusive practices.

The training covered the following topics:

- Welcome to Country / Acknowledgement of Country
- History – pre- and post-colonisation
- Aboriginal communities today
- Inclusion and reflective practice
- Aboriginal perspectives in the Victorian Curriculum

The training also aligns with the Framework for Improving Students Outcomes, including the state-wide priority positive climate for learning.

In the afternoon we addressed the statewide priority of developing Happy, Healthy and Resilient Kids.

Led by our Learning Specialist Lucy Garzarella and aided by Kathy Ugrai.

Staff explored classroom mindfulness, our "You Can Do It" and "Habits of Mind" programs.

You may have noticed the coloured keys in and around the school?

These keys are to act as reminders of our school's social and emotional development program.

"You Can Do It" was developed in Australia, at the University of Melbourne by Professor Michael Bernard.

It is a program with the goal of fostering the social and emotional development of children, assisting them to develop to their full potential. Within a common theme of developing RESILIENCE, the program focuses on the five key foundations of:

CONFIDENCE

PERSISTENCE

ORGANISATION

GETTING ALONG and

RESILIENCE.

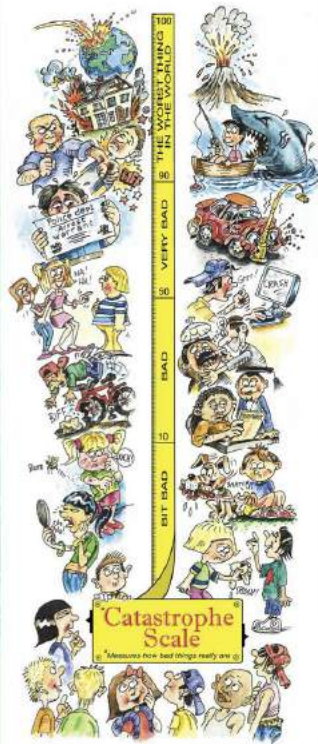
Social and Emotional Learning is taught explicitly through the "You Can Do It" program.

Teachers teach an aspect from the program on a needs base for their class. Lessons focus on the various aspects of the program, the Keys to Success (Persistence, Resilience, Get Along, Confidence, Organisation) or the Catastrophe Scale.

Ask your child how the catastrophe scale works.

HOWBADZZAT?

It's not as bad
as you think it is!



Introducing:

The Catastrophe Scale

The Catastrophe Scale helps us to build our resilience when bad things happen. Often, we think something is the worst thing in the world, when in actual fact, it is just 'a bit bad'. Recognising 'Howbaddzat' helps us to bounce back and move on, as opposed to blowing an event out of proportion.

Bad things happen, and The Catastrophe Scale helps us to put these events into perspective.

NAPLAN student message

A message to our students

To our valued students in Year 3 and Year 5,

In two weeks you will sit your NAPLAN tests.

Before you take these tests there is something very important for you to know. This test does not assess all of what makes each of you exceptional and unique. The mark you get from these tests will tell you how you did on that day, but they won't tell you everything.

NAPLAN can't tell you that you have persisted and improved on something you used to find difficult.

NAPLAN can't tell you that you brighten up your teacher's day but we know you do.

NAPLAN can't tell you how amazingly special you are, but we know you are.

The people who mark these tests don't know that you may love to sing, that you may love to draw, that you help your friends when they need you. They don't know that some of you can dance, speak another language, play music, are good at chess or can speak confidently in front of your class or at assembly.

They do not know that you participate in sports or that you help your mum or dad or that you play with your little brother, sister or cousins.

They do not know that you are caring, thoughtful and that every day you come to school to do your best, because these attributes cannot be tested.

So when you come to school ready to do your best at NAPLAN remember, "There is no one way to test all of the wonderful things that make you, YOU!"

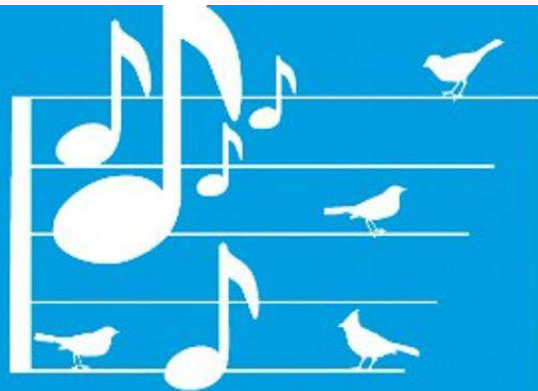

Soccer pitch timetable has been adjusted to make it a little bit fairer to all the grades and a new timetable was given to JSC members to give to their classes.

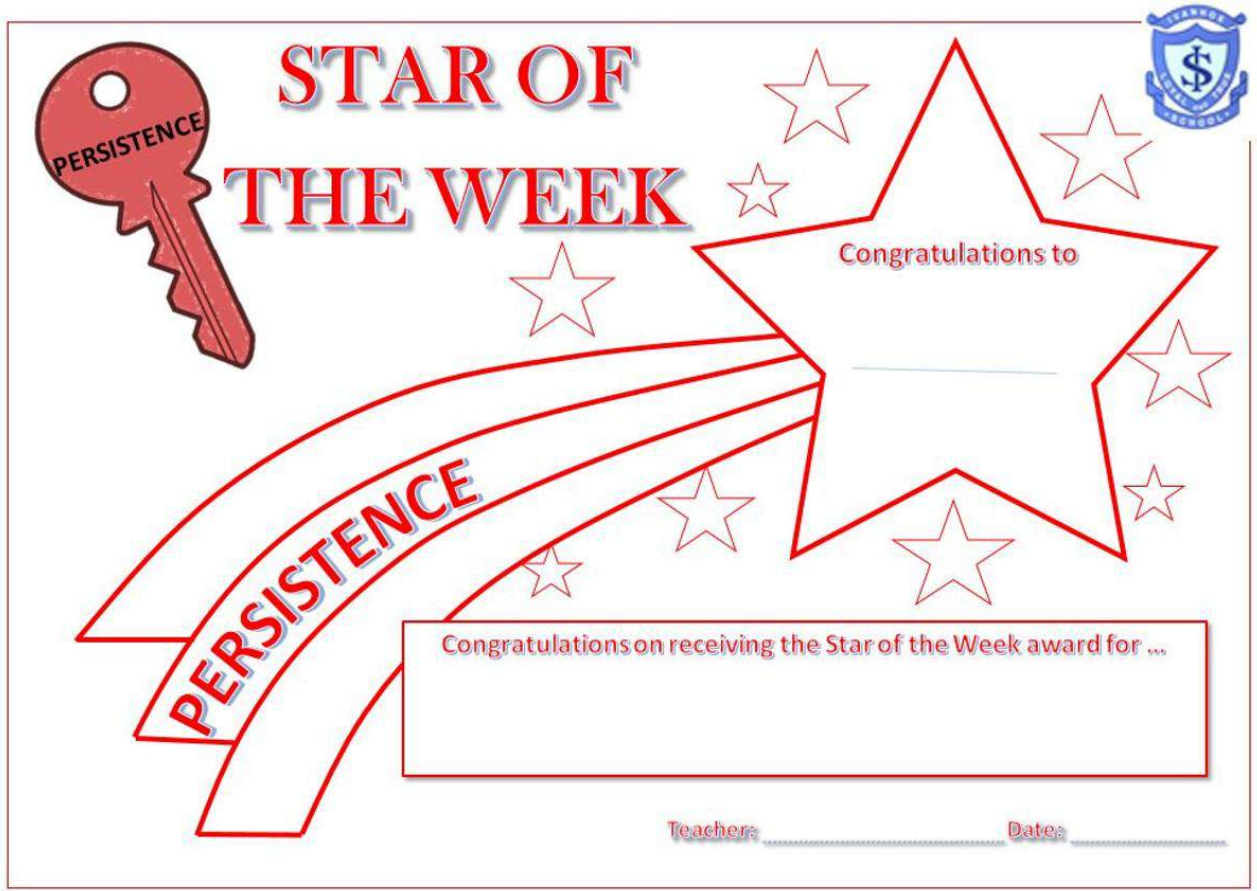

Throughout the year students participate in explicit teaching and learning activities to learn and understand the IPS School Values of Confidence, Independence, Persistence, Resilience and Respect.

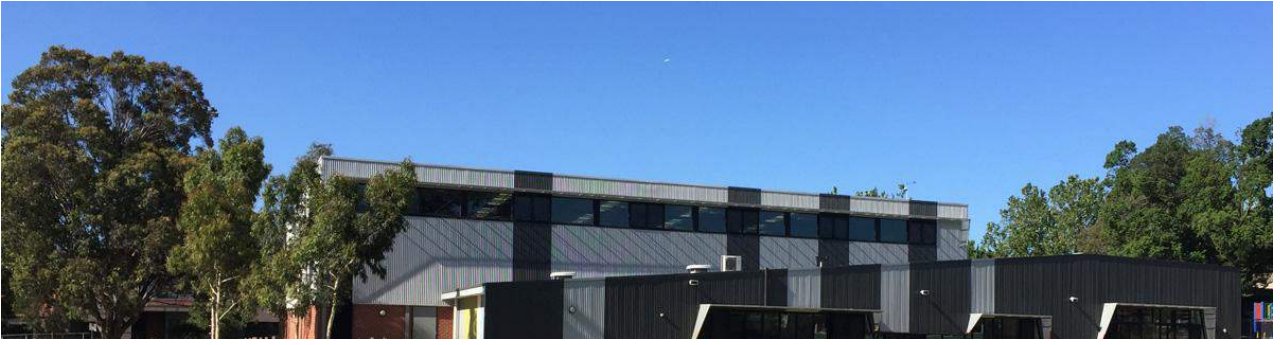


Ivanhoe Primary School provides;

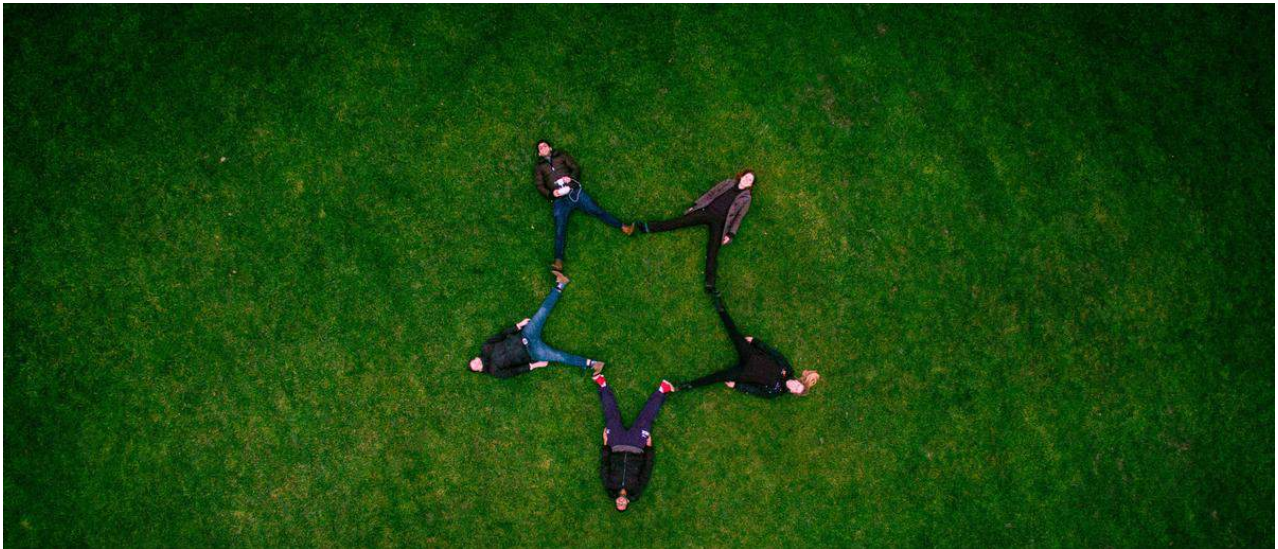
