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### From the Principal

Dear IPS Community,

Feedback from staff and one parent in particular who emailed me to share his thoughts confirms my belief that our community has much to be proud of in the way each and every one of us is an ambassador for Ivanhoe Primary School.

#### Building works to meet our enrolment.

The new relocatable building will be positioned as close to the current Year 1 and Year 2 classrooms as possible and once in position and the old toilet block is removed we can begin looking at landscaping the area in between the buildings adjacent to the indigenous garden as an outdoor learning and passive play space. Here again will be another opportunity to harness the ideas and talents of our community.

What might it look like? What are the opportunities for its development? Members of School Council and interested individuals recently applied for a sustainability grant which if successful would provide much needed development funds.

In the meantime work in preparation includes the relocation of several sprinkler heads and some temporary fencing. In 2017 new goal posts will be erected and landscaping will be a working bee priority.

Sue Jones continues to act on my behalf as acting principal supported by Heather Sierak (and other members of the leadership team) until I am able to return to work. Sue and I are in constant contact to ensure school business is attended to. I look forward to being back on deck as soon as possible and continuing to work with you to build on the excellence that is Ivanhoe Primary School.
